ORPC was recently honored to host Ms. Jocelyn Fleming Gutchess. Jocelyn is the daughter of Major Philip B. Fleming, who headed the Quoddy Dam Project in the 1930s. The project, begun but never completed in Eastport, Maine, was the city's first foray into tidal energy.

When Jocelyn was a child, she and her family lived for several years in housing specially built for the Quoddy Dam Project workers. By coincidence, Eastport native Bob Lewis, ORPC's director of operations, currently lives in the same neighborhood.

Today, Jocelyn still vividly recalls the time she spent in Eastport and Campobello Island, as well as her childhood fondness for the working model of the Quoddy Dam Project. The Border Historical Society still houses this model, and exhibits it to the public during summer months.
